


I KNOW, THEREFORE I SORT

I know, therefore I sort!

Since April 2018 we have been sorting waste into five bins: paper, glass, metals and plastics, bio and non-recyclable.

Gdańsk is following in the footsteps of Western European countries and has made full waste segregation a fact of life. Comprising five bins, the system will eventually cover all of Poland. The municipalities are now busy adapting their systems to ensure that in 2021 everyone will be able to sort their waste in the same way. And that's the way to go!



And our goal is?

The goal for the next year is for each municipality and its communities to achieve a 50% recycling target. This means that at least half of waste produced in a municipality must be recycled. The effort we all put in has helped us to hit 44% of the recycling target last year. And yes, things are going well, but there's a lot more to be done. Everyone should get better and better at how we handle waste and the city of Gdańsk should continue to improve its system and invest to achieve the targets in the years to come.

Where are the difficulties?

The people of Gdańsk have been really quick learning the new extended system. A high five, everyone!

Some waste, however, leaves some people in doubt. The brochure we have prepared for you goes over the sorting rules we have to follow in our city. There are hints and suggestions on how to prepare each type of waste before putting it into the bins. Non-typical waste is also explained such as bulky waste, electrical waste or other hazardous waste. We hope that you will keep this brochure and use its instructions as a manual on how to handle waste the right way in our city.

Hierarchy of handling municipal waste




Reduce!

In 2018 the average Gdansk resident threw away 423 kg of waste. Each year more and more waste is produced. Why? The high-consumption lifestyle means more packaging and short product life.

The emphasis in the waste handling hierarchy is on reducing and minimising waste. Think before you shop, choose recycled or recyclable products and use non-disposable products. Live the ECO way! And where

How much waste is produced per Gdańsk resident in a year?




waste cannot be reduced, make sure to sort it the right way. Remember, waste is raw material that can be reprocessed if properly separated.

Why?

Do you know how to sort PAPER the right way?



Paper like this cannot be recycled - put it into the non-recyclable bin



DON'T PUT IN **FOIL COATED PAPER**





Put it into the bio bin!



Folded cartons take up less space in the bin and during transport



GLASS – green bin



 $\sqrt{}$ empty drink and food bottles

(lids and tops removed)

- empty jars (lids removed) $\sqrt{}$
- $\sqrt{}$ empty glass cosmetics packaging



DO NOT PUT IN X

- X ceramics, flower pots, ceramicware, porcelain, crystal glassware
- spectacles X
- kitchen dishes, tampered glass tableware X and kitchenware, heat-resistant glass
- vigil lights with wax
- lightbulbs, fluorescent bulbs and reflectors X
- X medication, solvent and engine oil packaging
- mirrors X
- glass and reinforced panes X
- X monitors and TV lamps
- thermometers and syringes

YOU CAN LEAVE PAPER LABELS ON JARS AND BOTTLES

They are not good for recycling – put them into the non-recyclable

CRYSTAL GLASSWARE,

CRUSH PLASTIC BOTTLES AND TETRA PAKS



MAKE SURE ALL PACKAGING IS EMPTY

You don't need to wash packaging

Hints for the Super Sorter!

Do you know how to sort BIO WASTE the right way?



Put grass clippings or leaves in larger amounts into bags and put them on green waste collection day next to the bin store



Put them into the non-recyclable bin! PUT SMALL AMOUNTS
OF LEAVES OR GRASS
CLIPPINGS INTO
NO MATERIALS
SOILED
THE BIO BIN

NO STONES OR ASH!

NO ANIMAL

BONES



Put them into the non-recyclable bin!



DON'T PUT
SEMI-LIQUID WASTE
(such as dinner leftovers with gravy)
IN PLASTIC BAGS

WITH

ANIMAL FAECES

Prevent leakage by wrapping them in a paper towel OR RAW MEAT
PUT PAPER
TOWELS

AND TISSUES



Put them into the non-recyclable bin!





NON-RECYCLABLE -grey/black bin

Put in anything that cannot go into any of the other bins or cannot be recycled



- foil coated paper
- oily and dirty paper
- oily disposable paper dishes and disposable dishes
- used hygiene products, including disposable nappies
- animal bones and raw meat
- animal faeces and faeces soiled materials (including cat litter and bedding for rodents)
- clothes, small toys
- styrofoam from households (such as from packaging of appliances and white goods and disposable styrofoam dishes)
- ceramics, flower pots, ceramicware, porcelain, crystal glassware
- spectacles, mirrors
- heat-resistant glass and tampered glass tableware and kitchenware
- vigil lights with wax



building and demolition waste

- bulky waste
- hazardous waste
- used electrical and electronic appliance (including white goods)
- spare car parts and tyres
- engine oil and lubricant packaging
- paint and lacguer cans and containers
- batteries and accumulators
- medication and used medical products
- eedles and syringes

Hints for the Super Sorter!

Do you know how to sort NON-RECYCLABLE WASTE the right way?



Take non-recyclable waste back to the shop when you buy new items, deliver to a MUNICIPAL WASTE COLLECTION POINT

or hand it over to a hazardous waste collection service



You can dispose of up to 2 tonnes of such waste for free in a calendar year per each home or you can order a service from a waste contractor for a fee

NO BATTERIES, LIGHT BULBS, USED ELECTRICAL OR ELECTRONIC APPLIANCES (INCLUDING WHITE GOODS)

NON-TYPICAL AND HAZARDOUS WASTE



Bulky waste and tyres

put these next to the bin store on collection day by 6.00 am or on the day before after 9.00 pm

(please note! waste from home improvement such a bathtub, shower unit and used white goods such as a fridge are not bulky waste and will not be collected)



Building waste

- ✓ deliver these to a MUNICIPAL WASTE COLLECTION POINT*, up to 2 tonnes a year free per each home
- ✓ order a service from a waste contractor for a fee



Used electrical and electronic appliances (including white goods)

- take them back to the shop when you buy new items
- ✓ hand them over to a HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION SERVICE**
- √ deliver to a MUNICIPAL WASTE COLLECTION POINT*



Green waste

put the bags on bio waste collection day next to the bin store



Medication

- put it into special bins placed in pharmacies (you will find such pharmacies on www.czystemiasto.gdansk.pl)
- ✓ hand them over to a HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION SERVICE**
- ✓ deliver to a MUNICIPAL WASTE COLLECTION POINT*



Other hazardous waste

(such as paint, lacquer, solvents, thermometers, fluorescent bulbs, batteries and accumulators, pesticides, chemical reagents, lubricants, used oils, medication needles and syringes)

- ✓ hand them over to a HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION SERVICE**
- √ deliver to a MUNICIPAL WASTE COLLECTION POINT*

PLEASE NOTE!

Make sure not to leave building waste, refuse and hazardous waste, including used electrical and electronic appliances at bin stores!

You may be liable to a fine of PLN 500.
